

Non-Sequential PowerPoint

7th Grade – Technology

Objective: In this assignment you will build a PowerPoint assignment that allows the users to interactively guide themselves through the show – similar to the way a Web Page works.

Before you start: Make sure you have your Inspiration Part B completed and printed out. This printout will be your roadmap for this assignment.

1. Open a new PowerPoint presentation and immediately save it with a useful name (NOT PRESENTATION 1)
2. Make one slide for each shape in your Inspiration assignment. I suggest using a slide that has a title box. **Enter only the title of the slide at this time.**
3. EACH SLIDE SHOULD HAVE A PICTURE OR A CLIPART. Clipart and photos can be obtained from the On-Line Clipart Gallery (INSERT – PICTURE – CLIPART) or from Google.com. You should include at least some text to explain the photo/clipart.
4. **Making the Action Buttons:** You can watch the Web video on the *Making Buttons*, but here is the basics... Refer to your Inspiration flowchart. Each slide should have one “action button” for each arrow that LEADS AWAY FROM the shape. It may help to make a mark on your flowchart each time you create a button so you don’t get lost. DO NOT CREATE LINKS AT THIS TIME.
5. **Create Links:** When you are happy with all of your slides THEN add the hyperlinks. If hyperlinks are not added last, you will have problems. Watch the video on *Linking Buttons* for instructions.
6. When done, you need to turn in your project electronically. There is a video called “How to electronically drop off your PowerPoint project.” Watch that and do that.
7. Go to the front of the room. Files that have been dropped off into in drop off box will be projected up on the big screen. Make SURE your file appears in my drop off box.
